MUSIC CLIC SEMINAR



Using music as a tool in youth work further has the potential to cater to people's needs for expression (cultural, emotional, intellectual), and thus create the grounds for constructive discussion. Making music together, the seminar will encourage a positive attitude in the participants towards their own, and others' cultural expression, and will foster the development of interpersonal skills.

Music creates an environment where all cultures are welcome. Working together on a common goal will strengthen the group and make each participant valued and relatable. An intercultural night with music presentation by the participants will help the youth workers appreciating their personal and group achievements made.

- · Facilitating intercultural communication in the European Union
- Strengthening youth workers' competence of learning to learn, and developing youth workers' skills in intercultural communication, intuitive music education and improvisation
